Now that you have some new elements in your toolbox, we are going to make some improvements to a Monet website. You will find it very similar to the Van Gogh website from last week. Let's take a look...





Claude Monet

Claude Monet was a famous French painter whose work gave a name to the art movement Impressionism. In April 1874, in an independent exhibit that Monet and some other artists put together, Monet displayed his painting entitled "Impression, Sunrise" (1873), depicting Le Havre's harbor in a morning fog. Critics used the title to name the distinct group of artists as "Impressionists," saying that their work seemed more like sketches than finished paintings. Though they meant it in a derogatory way, the artists embraced he title and the term stuck.

Claude Monet was born on November 14, 1840, in Paris, France. He always loved the outdoors and started drawing at a young age. When he was sixteen his mother died and he went to live with his aunt, as his father did not approve of his wanting to pursue art. He served in the army for two years, but after recovering from typhoid fever, his annt purchased his release from service in exchange for Monet agreeing to epoll in an art school. He soon became disillusioned with with what he considered to be the outdated methods of the Renaissance and began painting his own way.

Monet's <u>paintings</u> are well loved and are part of art collections all over the world. To see his paintings, you will have to visit one of the many <u>museums</u> that have them in their collections.


 Add text above your list to tell your user they can click on the items of the list to see the paintings. Use <h3> for this text.

 after the zip code.


