Week 2 Jokes!

Create a folder called "Jokes." Then create an HTML file called "jokes.html" and put it in the "Jokes" folder. This file must contain at least 3 jokes or riddles. Instead of putting the answers/punchlines on the "jokes.html" page, you must make a link to a new page for each one. Put these files in your Jokes folder as well.

Your main page will look like this:

    <h1> Why did the chicken cross the road?</h1>

       Click <a href="answer1.html"> here </a> for the answer.
    <h1> Why did the goose cross the road?</h1>

    (Do the same for the 3rd joke.)

</html>
```

To finish the assignment you need to create 3 more HTML files. The first will be called "answer1.html." When someone clicks on the word "here" from the jokes page, the "answer1.html" file should open. The structure should be the same as what I have above, only change the title the "Answer 1" and then just put your joke's answer in either an <h1> tag or a tag. Remember to close the tag.

Remember how we styled the Starbuzz website last week? Here's the <style> that we used:

Remember: The <style> element is nested inside the <head> </head> tags.
