CHAT Web Design 1 Chapter 5 Images – A Fishing Expedition

In the process of designing web pages, you often need to find images that you can use. This assignment will give you a chance to do some fishing online to find specific pictures and then put them into a web page. Most will be linked directly, but a few will be downloaded and accessed through a folder called Images. (Don't use any images that are over 800 pixels wide. i.e. Make sure they fit easily in you browser window.)

File Structure:

- A root folder called Fishing
- An HTML file named "fishing.html" (provided) to be put inside the root folder
- An images folder named Images

Instructions:

Absolute Paths: You need to use internet searches to find the images below. Use the URL of the image in your image tag. (Right click on the image to find the URL.)

- 1. A sunset
- 2. Your favorite fruit
- 3. A flower
- 4. Someone climing a tree
- 5. A pet
- 6. Someone playing a sport
- 7. A historic site (add text to the web page to tell me what the site it is and where it is located)
- 8. Someone working at their job

Relative Paths: You need to use internet searches to find the images below. Use the "Save As" option you see when you right click on the image in order to save it to your Images folder. Then use a relative path in your image tag.

- 1. A famous painting (add text to the web page to tell me the name and artist of the painting)
- 2. A politician (add text to the web page to tell me who it is and what their office is)
- 3. Your favorite car
